Find out if you're eligible

- Volunteer or participate in community services and/or extracurricular activities
- Plan on attending middle school at OLL during the three years during which the scholarship is distributed
- Come well-recommended by their current school staff
- Have a strong academic foundation
- Are positive influences on their current school community
- Are new OLL students (not applicable to current OLL student body)

How to apply

It's easy to submit your application for an OLL Middle School Scholarship. Here's how the selection process works:

1. You Apply

Fill out and submit the [OLL Application](#) any time before May 31, 2013.

2. Schedule a school visit and meet the principal

3. Semi-Finalists Selected

Semi-final entries are reviewed by school principal. Semi-finalists will be notified in person.

4. Finalists Selected and Notified
